Upcoming programs

The **November** meeting of the Jacksonville Shell Club will be held at the usual venue, the Southeast Branch of the Jacksonville Public Library <<u>http://www.yelp.com/biz/jacksonville-public-library-</u> <u>southeast-regional-jacksonville</u>> on the **third** Thursday (the fourth being Thanksgiving Day) in Function Room **D** (vs. the customary **A**) at 7:00 PM. Harry Lee will present an as yet un-named enantiomorphic *Camaena* (**L**) from China (if nothing more you'll learn a new word for Scrabble®). For the main program, Rick Edwards will discuss "Shelling in Northeast Florida" from Marineland to the GA border. He will also include information on when, where, and how to collect on our area beaches as well as along with ample illustrations of shells and habitat.

The **December** meeting will be a combination field trip and club Holiday Dinner on **Saturday the 2nd**. The low tide is expected at

12:48 PM, so we should muster about 10:30 AM at Matanzas Inlet (**R**). We'll meet at Helen Mellon Schmidt County Park, where Paul [(904) 347-7254] and Rick will lead us to the shelling spots. 

A new methodology for landsnailers: ex cochlea shelling by Bill Frank

The pictured freshly deceased specimen was collected from the roadside swale on the west side of US-1 about 3.1 miles northwest of International Golf Parkway, St. Johns County, Florida on 11/9/2017. When subsequently checked several days later, the specimen was emitting a foul odor, so it was soaked in water in



removal of what was believed to be remains of the expired snail. During the removal process a pair of Daedalochila auriculata (Say, 1818), the Ocala Liptooth, and a pair of Polygyra septemvolva Say, 1818 the Florida Flatcoil, were also found in addition to the decomposing remains of the Euglandina. With smaller snails, Euglandina swallow their prey whole - shell and all. With larger prey the size of Daedalochila auriculata, Euglandina normally extract the living snail from the shell and discard the empty shell. However, with the armored aperture of Daedalochila auriculata, or any Liptooth for that matter, the latter
